



## “Your Kingdom Come”

The Lord’s Prayer (Part 2)

September 17, 2021

‘Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, <sup>10</sup> ***your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.*** <sup>11</sup> Give us today our daily bread. <sup>12</sup> And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. <sup>13</sup> And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.’ - Matthew 6:9–13 (NIV)

<sup>28</sup> “Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. <sup>29</sup> Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. <sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.” - Matthew 11:28–30 (NIV)

1. The sermon opened with the show *Squid Game* as an example of a broken world crying out for many of the things found in the Lord’s Prayer. (e.g. love, acceptance, purpose, justice, reconciliation, deliverance, etc). What are some other examples in which you see the world longing for these things? (e.g. books, movies, shows, news, real life, etc)
2. Pray the Lord’s prayer together (Mt 6:9-13) How did you interpret “*your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven*” in the past? How did the Bible Project video (Heaven & Earth) and/or the sermon challenge or re-frame your understanding of this line in the prayer?
3. Read Matt 11:28-30. How does Jesus’ invitation to take on his yoke make you feel? In what ways is this an encouragement to you? In what ways does it make you uncomfortable?
4. Share with the group what is burdening you these days, making your heart feel heavy or causing your soul to feel restless and pray for one another if time allows.

### **FOR FUTHER STUDY (together or on your own)**

Read Matthew 26:36-39. Do you ever find your will at odds with God’s will? What can we learn from the example of Jesus when we find ourselves in this place?
